*REGULATIONS made by the Public Utilities Commission, with the approval of the Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Public Utilities Commission by section 56 of the Belize Telecommunications Act, Chapter 229 of the Substantive Laws of Belize, Revised Edition 2020, and all other powers thereunto it enabling.*

**TELECOMMUNICATIONS (LICENSING  
CLASSIFICATION, AUTHORISATION AND  
FEE STRUCTURE) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2)  
REGULATIONS, 2022,**

and shall be read and construed as one with the Telecommunications (Licensing Classification, Authorisation and Fee Structure) Regulations, 2002, which, as amended, are hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations.

2. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 3(1) by deleting the following terms and their corresponding definitions—

Amendment of  
regulation 3.

(a) “carrier”; and

(b) “Public Switched Telephone Network or PSTN”.

3. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 4 by—

Amendment of  
regulation 4.

## Schedule I.

- (a) repealing sub-regulation (2) and replacing it with the following–

“(2) An Individual License shall be specific to an individual operator and shall be required to provide any or all of the services prescribed in Schedule I.”;

- (b) repealing sub-regulation (3) and replacing it with the following–

“(3) A Class Licence shall be–

(i) issued by the PUC within the framework of general authorisations made by the PUC;

(ii) issued where Individual Licenses are not justified and there may be a need to place certain conditions on the provisions of the service; and

(iii) required to provide any or all of the services prescribed in Schedule II.”;

## Schedule II.

- (c) repealing sub-regulation (6);

- (d) repealing sub-regulation (7) and replacing it with the following–

“(7) Frequency Authorisation from the PUC shall be required for any service that requires the use of specified frequencies.”;

- (e) inserting the following new sub-regulation immediately after sub-regulation (8)–

“(9) An application for a frequency authorisation shall be made to the PUC.”.

4. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 5 by repealing sub-regulation (2) and replacing it with the following–

Amendment of regulation 5.

“(2) An application for a licence under this regulation shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee prescribed in Schedule III.”.

Schedule III.

5. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 6 by repealing sub-regulation (2) and replacing it with the following–

Amendment of regulation 6.

“(2) An application for a licence under this regulation shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee prescribed in Schedule IV.”.

Schedule IV.

6. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 7 by repealing sub-regulation (2) and replacing it with the following–  
Schedule V.

Amendment of regulation 7.

“(2) An application for a licence under this regulation shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee prescribed in Schedule V.”.

Schedule V.

7. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 8 by–

Amendment of regulation 8.

- (a) repealing sub-regulation (1) and replacing it with the following–

“(1) A person who applies for an Individual Licence, a Class Licence

or a Frequency Authorisation shall be required to pay the fees prescribed in Schedules III, IV and V as follows–

- (a) on filing of application, the Application Fee;
- (b) on the grant, modification, renewal or transfer of the Licence or Frequency, the Grant, Modification, Renewal or Transfer Fee, as the case may be;
- (c) where such fee is prescribed as a percentage of gross revenue, at the end of the licensee’s fiscal year, the Annual Fee;
- (d) where such fee is fixed, the Annual Fee as follows–
  - (i) at the end of the calendar year on a pro-rated basis for the calendar years in which it was granted;
  - (ii) thereafter at the end of each calendar year;
  - (e) where such licence is issued on a temporary basis, the fee shall be pro-rated for the term of the temporary licence and payable in full upon the grant of the temporary licence.”;
- (b) repealing sub-regulation (2) and replacing it with the following–

“(2) Annual Fees for the Landing Station Operator licence classification are payable in addition to Annual Fees required for any other services a licensee is authorised to provide.”;

- (c) inserting, immediately after sub-regulation (2) the following–

“(3) Where a person applies for the grant, modification, renewal or transfer of a Licence or Frequency, the applicable fees prescribed in Schedules III, IV and V, as the case may be, for each category of licence being applied for, are payable.

Schedules III, IV and V.

(4) The miscellaneous fees prescribed in Schedule VI are payable for the telecommunications prescribed in that Schedule.”.

Schedule VI.

8. The principal Regulations are amended by repealing the Schedule and replacing it with the following–

“**SCHEDULE I**

*[regulation 4 (2)]*

Repeal and replacement of Schedule.

**Individual Licence Classification**

1) **Fixed Public Telephony (wireless or wireline)** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network to provide a service to the public that allows the user the ability to transmit signals over a distance for the purpose of communications where the end points are fixed.

2) **Public Mobile Cellular** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network to provide a wireless service to the public that allows the user the ability to transmit signals over a distance for the purpose of communications where the end points are not fixed.

3) **Public Radio Paging** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network to provide a wireless service to the public that allows the user the ability to transmit messages

only over a distance for the purpose of communications where the end points are or are not fixed.

4) **Internet Networks** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network to provide access for the provision of public Internet access services. The Licencee can have access to the exclusive or non-exclusive use of a specified assigned radio frequency or radio frequency band.

**SCHEDULE II**

[regulation 4 (3)]

**Class Licence Classification**

**1 Internet Service Provider** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network to provide wireless access for the provision of public Internet access services. The Licencee<sup>2</sup> can have access to the non-exclusive use of a specified radio frequency or radio frequency band.

**2 Carrier Services Provider** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a network that is offered for hire to other licence holders, or to other authorised persons as may be determined by the PUC, whether in whole or in part.

**3 Value Added Services Provider** – authorises the holder to provide value-added services as defined in the Act and these Regulations.

**4 Reseller** – authorizes the holder to–

- (i) either build, own and operate an Internet network to resell services provided by another licensee on a wholesale basis; or
- (ii) obtain such other telecommunication services on a wholesale or discounted basis, and as approved for reselling by the PUC from time to time, and resell those services or components of such services to its own customers.

**5 (1) Landing Station Operator** – authorises the holder to build, own and operate a facility or facilities to enable the holder, and other licensees on non-discriminatory terms, to connect to–

- (a) any other communications network outside of Belize; and
- (b) any earth-orbiting apparatus.

(2) The corresponding Annual Fee prescribed in Schedule IV is for every two locations or methods of landing, or for both, and is payable on application for the first of any two locations or methods of landing to be used.

**6 Domestic Private Network** – means a network based on leased lines or other facilities which are used to provide telecommunication services within an organization or within a closed user group.

**9.** (1) The Telecommunications (Licensing Classification, Authorisation and Fee Structure) (Amendment) Regulations, 2022, Statutory Instrument No. 162 of 2022 are hereby revoked.

Revocation and revival.

(2) On the revocation of Statutory Instrument 162 of 2022, the original provisions of the principal regulations that were affected by Statutory Instrument 162 of 2022 are revived.

**10.** (1) Regulation 9 of these Regulations shall come into force on the 13th day of December, 2022.

Commencement.

(2) Regulation 2 to regulation 8 of these Regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of December, 2022.


